Antelope Valley Indian Museum State Historic Park is California's State Regional Indian Museum representing Great Basin The Indian Cultures. exhibits and interpretive emphasis are on American Indian groups (both aboriginal contemporary) of the Southwest, Great Basin, and California culture regions, since Antelope Valley was a major prehistoric trade corridor linking all three of these culture regions. The museum contains the combined collections of founder Howard Arden Edwards and subsequent owner Grace Oliver. A number of the cultural materials on display are rare or one-of-akind objects. The museum was originally constructed by homesteader and artist H. Arden Edwards in 1928. The chalet-style structure was built over an entire rock formation of Piute Butte in the Mojave Desert.

From national softball tournaments and city events to company picnics to family reunions and children's birthday parties, you'll always find something happening at this tree-lined park that encompasses more than 63 acres. Formerly named Lancaster City Park, the Lancaster City Council approved the renaming of the park on October 25, 2016 to honor the memory and legacy of Sqt. Steve Owen, who died in the line of duty October 5, 2016 when responding to a burglary call. Sgt. Owen is known for his many contributions to our community and the larger Antelope Valley. He gave of his time unconditionally to local sports programs, his church, colleagues, special events, and family. His

love for his family and community was paramount in his life. In addition to an impressive activity center with a full kitchen, game room and auditorium, Sqt. Steve Owen Memorial Park is also home to eight lighted tennis courts, basketball and volleyball courts, and our Big 8 Softball Complex. The Stanley Kleiner activity center was built in the mid-1980s and named after Lancaster's first Mayor. A large, covered group picnic shelter is an excellent location for barbecues, and there are more than a dozen individual picnic tables conveniently located throughout the park. A favorite location for children, the tot lot features colorful playground equipment and over sized boulders where kids can test their rock-climbing skills.

When most people think of the word "park," they envision grassy fields, shade trees and picnic tables. In 1996, Lancaster helped residents expand their traditional definition of "park" by adding a state-of-the-art baseball stadium and ballpark. The \$14.5 million facility offers luxury skyboxes, a state-of-the-art video message board and an old-fashioned manual scoreboard. The stadium can accommodate over 7,000 fans and features slightly over 4,600 permanent full chair stadium seats. Two expansive grass berm general admission areas are available when all seats are sold out to make a perfect setting for families to stretch out with a blanket and take in a ballgame. Lancaster Municipal Stadium's reputation is known throughout southern California. In fact, several companies have filmed commercials and movies at the facility.

First proposed in 1985, the Prime Desert Woodland Preserve is the result of the efforts of many local residents and the Lancaster City Council. This scenic location nestled within an urban area has been established to provide visitors opportunity to learn about the animals, plants and the region in which we live, as well as a place to simply relax and enjoy nature. The new exhibition designed by the Lancaster Museum of Art and History (MOAH), explores each of the major areas the center has traditionally included such as fauna, flora, geology, native peoples, and historical figures -- while increasing audience engagement through a more interactive experience. New to the interpretive center is a petroglyph and pictograph wall where visitors are invited to make their own pictographs in chalk. In addition, the preserve now offers an excavation station which includes replica bones, artifacts, and genuine geodes; an expanded library and reading area for children and adults; a reimagined touch

table where guests can have a hands-on experience with real animal hides, horns, and antlers; and regular workshops inspired by the landscape.







AGENCYPROFILE

The Housing Rights Center was founded in 1968, the same year Congress passed the Fair Housing Act. HRC has addressed the challenges of housing discrimination without interruption since that time and continues to expand and diversify its services and programs to meet the need and ever changing issue of fair housing.

The Housing Rights Center's mission is to actively support and promote fair housing through education and advocacy to the end that all persons have the opportunity to secure the housing they desire and can afford, without discrimination based on their race, color, religion, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, familial status, marital status, disability, ancestry, age, source of income or other characteristics protected

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

The Housing Rights Center provides a wide array of programs and services to its clients free of charge. HRC staff is able to assist clients in seven different languages: Spanish, Mandarin, Korean, Armenian, Russian, Cantonese, and English.

Discrimination Complaint Investigation

HRC investigates allegations of housing discrimination. The Discrimination Investigation Team conducts fact finding investigations and proposes potential solutions for the client. Case resolution can include mediation, conciliation, a referral to state and federal administrative agencies, or a referral to the HRC Litigation Department.

Enforcement & Litigation

HRC has developed unique and broad-based legal strategies to help clients and communities defeat housing discrimination. Using evidence collected by investigators and testers, HRC's Litigation Department has successfully litigated numerous fair housing and unfair business practices cases. The Department's lawyers have obtained Consent Decrees and verdicts that not only end discriminatory practices and redress injuries, but also serve to educate a broader audience about fair housing issues through publicity and trainings funded by defendants.

Predatory Lending Hoteine

HRC works to eliminate predatory lending practices through our anti-predatory lending hotline. Counselors are available to answer questions regarding home mortgage and refinance issues and predatory lending schemes, and will provide referrals to appropriate agencies for further assistance.

Outreach & Education

HRC has developed an effective outreach and education program that seeks to educate the community in appropriate languages regarding how housing injustices arise, the applicable laws that protect against housing discrimination and ways to prevent housing injustices. HRC also presents large special events throughout the year such as the Annual Housing Rights Summit, and Accommodating Tenants with Disabilities: A Workshop for Landlords.

Landlord/Tenant Counseling

Many of the people that come to HRC for assistance have basic questions about landlord and tenant rights and responsibilities. Our housing counselors provide clients with comprehensive information they can use to resolve those problems.

Advocacy

HRC participates in a variety of advocacy efforts. For example, HRC recently worked with a coalition of fair housing and civil rights advocates to support AB 976. This California bill clarifies housing providers' obligations not to inquire about a tenant's immigration status, and prohibits municipalities from adopting laws that would require a landlord to take action on such information. This bill became law in January 2008.


